Program Focus:

The RPTW Drug Interdiction course is a 2 day workshop intended to provide law enforcement officers with the most current information regarding enforcement strategies and responses to a variety of drug crimes that may occur in their jurisdictions. The investigation and prosecution of drug crimes by **Patrol, Interdiction and Drug Task Force** officers is the focus of the program. The development of enforcement strategies to counter criminal trafficking patterns are presented and discussed.

Who Should Attend: Qualified applicants must be full-time, sworn law enforcement peace officers.

Eligibility: This program is being funded by the FLETC's Rural Policing Institute. Preference for admission into this program is given to non-federal law enforcement officers or other emergency responders working in rural areas. "Rural" is defined as any area outside of a metropolitan statistical area (MSA), as defined by the Office of Management and Budget; or any jurisdiction inside of a MSA located in a county, borough, parish or land under the jurisdiction of an Indian Tribe with a population of no more than 50,000.
