Shelbyville Police Chief Austin Swing is recovering from his heart by-pass surgery nicely and was able to make it to the February meeting....guess not even heart problems will keep some members away.

Collierville PD raised over \$48,000 for Special Olympics of Tennessee this year and finished as the #1 department in both gross and net dollars raised.

Newport Police Chief Maurice Shults has been appointed to a 2-year term on the Appalachia High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Task Force for TN, KY, and WV. He will be representing all municipal police departments in the region on the federally funded task force to combat illegal drug trafficking.

February Business Meeting Minutes – February 3, 2006 8:00am

Director Godwin called the Business Meeting to order. Invocation was given and the Pledge of Allegiance recited. Minutes from the last meeting were approved.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Ms. Duncan introduced the newly appointed Director of the Governor's Highway Safety Office, Kendall Poole. Mr. Poole gave brief remarks expressing appreciation for the support and work of the TACP.

Director Mark Gwyn of the TBI gave a report on the status of the potential merger of the THP CID with the TBI. Mr. Gwyn reported that he has met with Kroll on several occasions. The first was informational regarding the TBI. The second, a merger was discussed. Mr. Gwyn advised the membership to wait until a recommendation comes down before forming an opinion. He advised of major overhauls at the THP. His preference is to fix the THP. Mr. Gwyn received and answered questions.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Special Sessions Update: The State of the State Address is scheduled for Tuesday night, pending the outcome of the House and Senate sessions on Monday and the progress they make on the Ethics Bill. A summary of the Bill will be forthcoming.

A Proposal approved by the Board of Directors for Red Light Traffic Enforcement vendors to prepare a fifteen minute presentation to be given at the April Meeting/Mid-Year Vendor EXPO. We need your approval to progress any further. Motion made, seconded and approved.

Ms. Duncan requested any information from any department who has had an officer killed in the line of duty in the last three years.

Committee Assignments and Reports: Ms. Duncan distributed corrected copies of the meeting schedule. Ms. Duncan explained that the purpose of these meeting was to discuss issues presented and have a report ready for the next meeting of the Board. Reports will be due one week prior to scheduled Board Meetings. An example format is included in the Board Notebooks. Ms. Duncan explained each area included in the example. There is a list at the desk of Committee Assignments. Please see Michelle O'Neill for help. Committees will meet during each meeting from 11:00 to 1:00 p.m at the discretion of the chair.

DUI Task Force- Ms. Duncan explained that due to concern about this being a legislative action, the Governor has decided to make an announcement soon through an Executive Order. The main purpose of this is to streamline the DUI laws to enhance conviction rates. The secondary purpose is to strengthen DUI laws. Deputy Chief Taylor will represent the TACP and Chief Freeman Cooper will represent the Public Safety Coalition. This provides for two police chiefs to represent the membership. Ms. Duncan will serve as the Recorder for the Task Force in order to facilitate the Task Force in setting and achieving goals. Ms. Duncan states that she hopes for an announcement to coincide with the statewide conference for the TACP.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Membership Committee – Ms. Duncan - There are a total of 554 members to TACP. There are 7 new agencies, 3 new business members, and 23 new members being added this meeting.

Financial Oversight Committee – Glenn Chrisman - The beginning balance as of October 31, 2005 was \$49,648.13 and the balance at the end of November was \$40,610.33 and the end of December was \$37,477.18. TACP is waiting for grant reimbursement of \$16,114.94 leaving a balance of \$53,592.12 as of December 31, 2005. In addition, the Leadership Training Endowment Fund has a balance of \$98,571.40.

Legislative Committee – Sterling Owen - The Governor's State of the State Address will be carried live on local television channels. This year the legislative issues to be submitted will include the Pawn Shop bill, Assault on Officers bill, Drag/Street Racing, Crooks with Guns, no guns in bars, DUI Task Force and Custodial Interrogation.

Futures II Committee – Gill Kendrick - It is imperative that all the membership be aware of the IRS requirements regarding cell phone usage. All agencies must have a cell phone usage policy because personal usage is taxable. The policy must state that if the phone is used for personal use, the employee must pay for it. Also disciplinary action can occur for misuse of the cell phone. Information is available at www.fws.gov or you can contact Raymond.mclennan@irs.gov (270.442.2607 ext 127).

SACOP/IACP – Gill Kendrick - The Homeland Security Committee will have a power point presentation ready for explanation of the 2006 NIMS requirements. The IACP will provide a desk reference to each new chief that attended school this week. The day on the hill for SACOP representatives is Mary 4-7, 2006 in Alexandria, Va. Weapons are now coming out in colors. Seracote firearms coating system is on the website

Leadership and Membership Committee – Ms. Duncan - The committee approved a transfer of \$40,000 to a high yield CD. Chief Lowery asked to fund the training for the annual conference.

University Committee – Bruce Harber – Committee is working on an Alert system between universities to notify them when a student transfers in with a criminal history.

Ethics and Standards Committee – Jack Baldwin – Bill Dunn, Republican Leader of the House, believes an Ethics Bill will be finalized on Friday and upon its completion, will be glad to come explain it to the TACP.

By-Laws Committee – Kim Wallace – no report.

Training Committee – Freeman Cooper – no report.

Homeland Security Committee – Don Green – Will maintain previous priorities of interoperable communications. The Fusion program will provide a standardized reporting system relating to suspicious persons. This will be a password protected, web-based program. A request was made to TEMA to evaluate the monies being spent and to ensure that they are being spent responsibly. Guidelines were requested and rejected by TEMA. The funding packets for 2006 came out Dec. 06 and are due back by March 2, 2006. There is \$4M in State Homeland Security grants, \$3M in Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention. Additional funding will be competitive.

E911 Advisory Committee – David Moore – sent back to the table to develop a plan of action. Chief Moore has been requested to sit on the Funding Committee and he is the only municipal government representative on this committee.

Alarm Management – John Lowery – There has been a 47% reduction in alarm calls in Johnson City since enacting the alarm ordinance.

Public Safety Coalition Meeting – Jim Tusan – The memorandum of purpose was approved by the TACP, the TSA, and the District Attorney General's Conference. Coalition liaisons were established and Larry Godwin and Sterling Owen will represent the TACP. The legislative agenda includes: (1) Pawnshop Thumbprint expand statewide bill, (2) Assault and Aggravated Assault on Officers, (3) Crooks with Guns (to be handled by the DAG), and (4) Custodial Interrogation concerns. There will be a statewide media blitz and you are asked to support the efforts and utilize the press releases and such..

Retirement Committee – Ricky Watson – They will be meeting on Feb. 10 with Ed Hennessey of TCRS.

Meth PR – Bob Terry – There has been no response on this. Ms Duncan will contact the Governor's Office.

Motion made to accept the Committee Reports. Motion to second and reports were approved.

TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION WITH YOUR LEGISLATOR

Your state legislator receives a large volume of phone calls and mail from their constituents. Remember, they work for you. How then, can you be sure your voice is heard? Here are some tips to help you get the most impact out of your communications with your state legislator.

GENERAL TIPS

- Know who your state legislator is and how to contact them. If you don't know who represents you, you can find out by using the *Find Your Legislator* button on the Members section of the Senate or House web page or you can contact your County Election Commission.
- The General Assembly's web site <http://www.legislature.state.tn.us/> will give you the mailing addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of Tennessee's state legislators.
- Make sure you understand the legislative process. Even the most basic understanding of the process will help you effectively express your ideas.
- Contact your legislator about a particular issue before the Legislature takes action on it. Most matters coming before the Legislature are well publicized before and during session. Calendars for committee and floor action are posted on the General Assembly's web site and updated frequently. You can also listen to the committee meetings over the internet.
- You can use a variety of communication methods. You might choose to telephone, write, e-mail, fax, or visit your legislator.
- Tell your legislator what effect you think a particular bill, if it becomes law, will have on you, your children, business, or community. Be concise and specific.
- Be polite to your legislator and their staff, even if you disagree strongly with the legislator you are addressing. Lawmakers cannot please everyone. Your communication will be more effectively received if you are reasonable in your approach.
- Suggest a course of action and offer assistance. Please don't make promises or threats.

WRITING EFFECTIVE LETTERS/EMAILS

- Be absolutely certain you spell your legislator's name correctly and use the correct address. If you don't, you could lose your audience.
- Type or print legibly. Sign your name neatly and give your address correctly so your legislator can respond to your letter.
- Keep letters, e-mail, and faxes brief. Try to keep it to one page. Concise written correspondence is more likely to grab the reader's attention and get a quick response.
- Identify your issue or opinion at the beginning of the letter. This will make your focus and intent clear.
- Cover only one issue per letter if you can. It would be best to write another letter for additional unrelated issues.
- Back up your opinions with supporting facts. Your letter should be informative.
- Avoid abbreviations or acronyms, and don't use technical jargon as the legislator may not be familiar with such.
- Keep in mind that personalized letters have more impact.

CALLING OR VISITING YOUR LEGISLATOR

- Plan your call or visit carefully. Stay focused and to the point and try to discuss only one issue at a time.
- Organize your thoughts ahead of time and make notes to help you stay on track.
- When planning to visit your legislator, make an appointment. Don't just drop by their office because they may not be able to see you due to other commitments. Call or write for an appointment as soon as you know when you are planning a visit.
- Prepare a one-page fact sheet concerning your issue to give to your legislator. This will help him or her better retain what you present.
- Be sure to follow-up a call or visit with a thank-you and to keep an eye on your issue. Repetition is key; so don't be afraid to contact your legislator more than once on an issue of concern to you.

Legislators need and want to hear from you. Otherwise, they are forced to make decisions on important issues without knowing the impact on you and your community.
